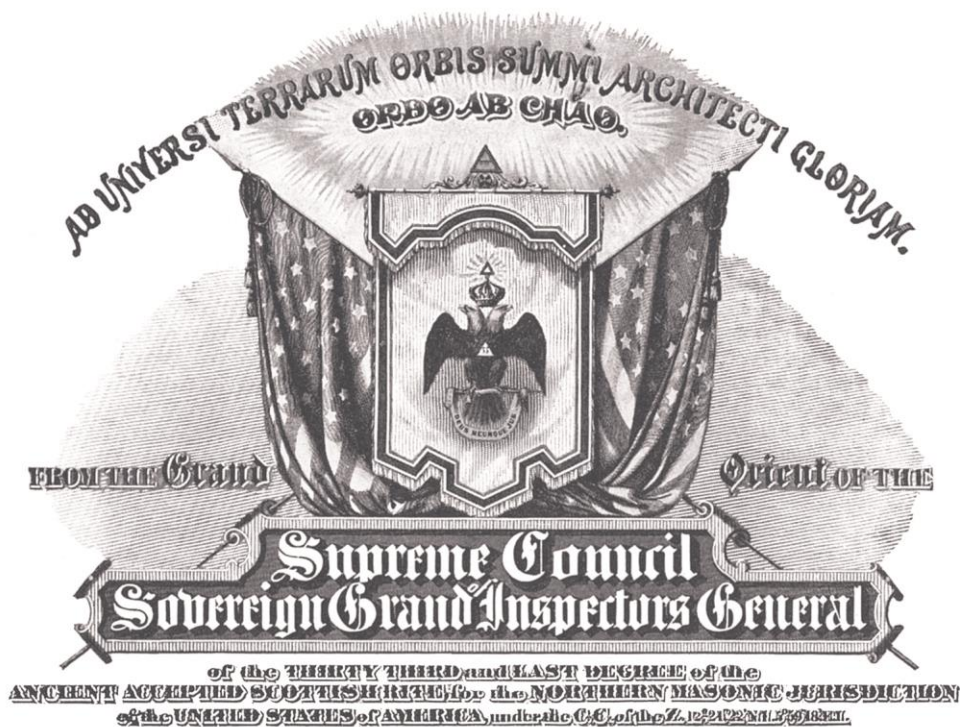

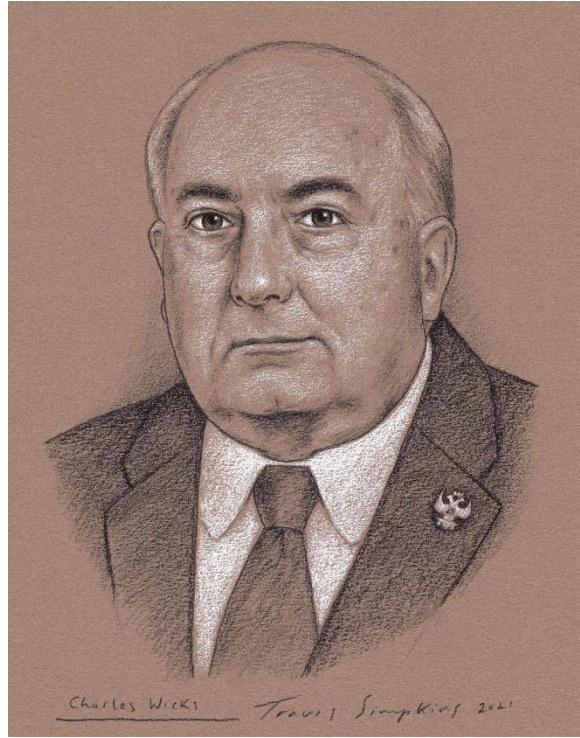

Charles C. "Chuck" Wicks was born May 28, 1945, in Goshen, Indiana, to Charles S. and Christine (Carter) Wicks.

Brother Charles was a 1963 graduate of St. Martins High School, New Orleans, Louisiana. He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Tulane University in 1967 and a Doctor of Jurisprudence degree from Indiana University Maurer Law School in 1970. He was also a graduate of the Indiana Judicial College.

On Oct. 31, 1970, he married Penny (Krull) Wicks.

Illustrious Brother Charles was an attorney in Elkhart, former part-time deputy prosecutor for 30 years and retired as judge of Superior Court 5, Elkhart. He was a member of the Elkhart City Bar Association and Goshen City Bar Association, president of the Elkhart Community Corrections Advisory Board from 2012 to 2018, and served on the Special Courts Committee of the Indiana Judicial Conference.

He served in the U.S. Air Force from 1970 to 1974 and received an Air Force Commendation Medal.

Active in the community, he was a member of Elkhart Shriners, Kiwanis, and started Elkhart Pachyderm. A member of St. James' Episcopal Church, he loved his church.

Brother Charles was an avid golfer and movie buff. He enjoyed boating and traveling with his family.

He is survived by his wife, Penny, Elkhart; daughter, Kristin Wicks, Chicago, Illinois; sons, Jay C. (Susan) Wicks, Elkhart, and Scott R. Wicks, Elkhart; three grandchildren, Aleesa (Stephano) Euells, Gavin Cass and David Reed; two great-grandchildren, Addison and Jeremiah; sister, Carolyn Albins, New Orleans, Louisiana; and niece Hillary Albins and nephew Nathanael Albins.



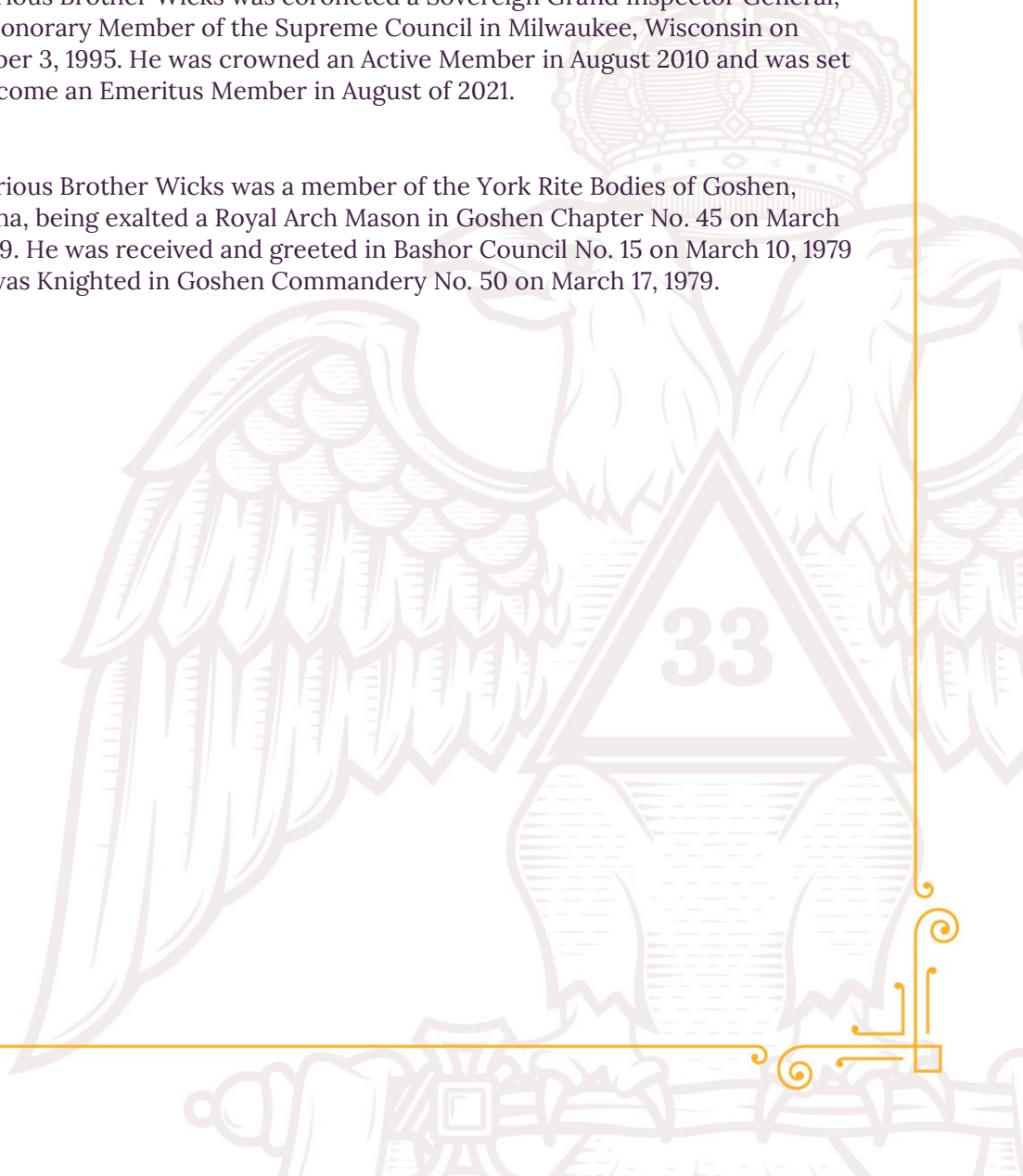
Our Illustrious Brother had a distinguished career in Freemasonry:

SYMBOLIC: Raised a Master Mason in Goshen Lodge No. 12, Goshen, Indiana, where he served as Worshipful Master in 1980 and Trustee from 1981-83.

SCOTTISH RITE Received the degrees of the Scottish Rite in the Valley of South Bend on April 23, 1977, where he was Commander-in-Chief from 1992-94.

SUPREME COUNCIL Illustrious Brother Wicks was coroneted a Sovereign Grand Inspector General, 33° Honorary Member of the Supreme Council in Milwaukee, Wisconsin on October 3, 1995. He was crowned an Active Member in August 2010 and was set to become an Emeritus Member in August of 2021.

YORK RITE Illustrious Brother Wicks was a member of the York Rite Bodies of Goshen, Indiana, being exalted a Royal Arch Mason in Goshen Chapter No. 45 on March 6, 1979. He was received and greeted in Bashor Council No. 15 on March 10, 1979 and was Knighted in Goshen Commandery No. 50 on March 17, 1979.





A memorial service for Illustrious Brother Charles C. Wicks was held on May 20 at Rieth-Rohrer-Ehret Funeral Home, 311 S. Main St., Goshen, followed by burial at Violet Cemetery.
